As some of you know I often work in my office until 6 p.m. on weekdays when I am in DeKalb. Jindrich would stop in on his way home about one day a week to chat briefly and go on. He always asked about how my father was doing, but we also talked about many things. Often he asked me to pray for him or his family — especially his children and grandson.

His concern for the Department was great; he wanted it to be top quality and its quality to be recognized. He was well aware of the diversity in the Department and understood it – and ACTED on that understanding. He encouraged the younger professors -"we must help them", he would say.
